The DEA Role



137. (2) The Nunavut Education Act:

A DEA shall work with students, parents, Elders, principals, vice-principals, teachers and others with an interest in education to achieve excellence and quality in education, to support students and to contribute to lifelong learning.




16. The Nunavut Education Act:

A District Education Authority shall monitor, evaluate, and direct the delivery of the School Program.

The Role of the DEA





What is the School Program Plan?



20. (1) Nunavut Education Act.

School Program Plan

Subject to such direction as the district education authority may give, a principal shall develop an operational plan for the school for the school year, to be known as the "school program plan".

Scope of plan

(2) A school program plan shall cover how the school program will be delivered to the students of the school and any other matters necessary for the operation of the school.

Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit

(3) A principal shall develop a school program plan in accordance with Inuit societal values and the principles and concepts of Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit, particularly the principles of Pijitsirniq and Aajiiqatigiinniq.



The Principal's Role



The Nunavut Education Act:

7.(6). A Principal shall conduct, in co-operation with education staff a continuing program of evaluation of the School Program in his or her school.

14. A Principal shall, in accordance with the regulations, report twice a year to the DEA and the Minister on the effectiveness of the School Program.

The Principal's Role



What information would you like to hear about from the Principal when they report on the School Program Plan?

Example:

- number of children registered? (change from year to year)
- #of expected graduates?
- # of children who left school.
- # of children requiring additional learning support by grade.
- diagnostic services needed.
- Areas that have been identified by administration for improvement.
- Other community priorities?

Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit




Duty of All

1. (3) It is the responsibility of the Minister, the district education authorities and the education staff to ensure that Inuit societal values and the principles and concepts of Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit are incorporated throughout, and fostered by, the public education system.


